

## **Purpose:**

The Provost Excellence in Student Learning Outcomes Award recognizes an academic degree program that is committed to best practices in assessment, improving student learning, and continuous program improvement.

#### **Nomination Process:**

Annually, each college or degree-granting unit can select one program to be nominated for the award. The college or degree-granting unit submits the program nomination form to the Office of Educational Effectiveness Assessment. Each program will be reviewed by the award committee.

### Who is Eligible?

Only degree granting-programs are eligible (including all nine colleges, the Golisano Institute of Sustainability, and the School of Individualized Study). The program shall not have been a recipient of this award in the preceding three years.
