- Quorum is %'s of voting members which is 14 members when we are at full capacity of 20 voting positions.
 - If a voting member is absent, they are required to send a proxy to senate.
 - A proxy is a member of their college
- There are 3 options for voting:
 - Yes
 - o No
 - Abstain
 - An Abstain is when a member does not want to give opinion
- When making a motion, a member must say, "I motion/move to"
 - This requires a second which is followed by a brief discussion
 - Incidentals are motions that are settled immediately
 - Ex: Points of Order and Points of Information
 - Used for when rules need to be enforced and when questions

 - o SG holds the right to remove any peitions that are not in compliance with the policy
- GCCIS: If I see a PawPrint that is about my college, is it a conflict of interest if I tell people to sign it?

- Ops: If you see a PawPrint that doesn't have 200 signatures that you want to work on, it can still be brought up to Senate to get charged to you.
