<u>CaPs</u>

Sarah Godoy, Director of CaPs

- Big Picture of Collegiate Mental Health
 - Anxiety and depression continue to be the most common mental health diagnoses

 - 53% of students are experiencing loneliness
 - 23% of students experiencing serious psychological distress (Kessler 6).
 - 29% of students reported their overall level of stress was high in the last 30 days.
- 1,656 Unique Students Served in Counseling Services
 - 7,754 Appointments
- 188 Unique Students served in Psychiatric Students
 - 629 Appointments
- 381 unique students served in Student Health Center
 - o 804 Appoints
- • 1/₃ of RIT students have been diagnosed with anxiety (RIT Well-Being Survey from Fall 2023)
- RIT Students show similar levels of psychological symptoms of distress as students nationally (CCAPS scores)
- Personalized Response: Stepped Care
 - 1: Needs Assessment
 - o 2: Campus Referrals
 - 3: Single Session Therapy
 - 4: Workshop/Support Groups
 - 5: Individual Therapy
 - 6: Therapy Groups
 - 7: Extended Individual Therapy
 - 8: Psychiatric Referral
 - 9: Community Referral
- "CaPS provides effective care"
 - 87% would recommend to a friend
 - 85% find CaPS was helpful
 - 83% had an improvement in relationships
 - 77% had better academic decision making
 - 71% had improvement in academic performance
 - 56% got more involved in campus activities
- RIT has over 500 staff/faculty/students trained in Mental Health Aid
- It takes a village
 - Kindness, connection, care does not always require a clinical degree
 - Infuse well-being into all aspects of campus life
