#### **CLCE Presentation**

- ROAR the Vote & Relevant Policies
  - This year is an election year in November.
  - We have not seen this much interest in a Presidential election in my 3 election seasons here!
  - ROAR the Vote is our on campus resource with the goal of getting our students interested in voting in elections
  - We are non-partisan
    - We do not represent or endorse any party, we just want students to vote and use their voice.
  - There are absentee parties to help students with absentee ballots, correct mailing addresses and stamps.
  - We recognize that students are not only the future of our democracy but also vital contributors to its present. Our campus is currently helping students harness their influences.
  - o CaPs has put together a list of Resilience Through the Election Cycle
    - If you are overwhelmed, feeling certain things, it is a lot to carry and navigate, so these are tips for everyone to make sure you're staying grounded this election season.
    - Pre and Post Election resources if you feel various emotions
    - Giving this to SG to give out how you see fit as well
  - Vote.org deadlines are approaching!
  - o Policy C10: Political & Legislative Activities Policy how does it apply to SG
    - We are a tax exempt organization, which means it cannot intervene in political campaigns on behalf of any kind of candidate or party.
    - As individual members
      - Entirely free to support whoever they want! We want you to passionately vote. You are allowed to talk about it with your peers
      - For leaders in this room, it gets tricky as an SG representative.
         Sometimes you are representing SG in an RIT manner.
    - RSOs vs SG vs Individual
      - RSO = Student Org
      - SG = Governing Council
    - When SGers are in their official capacity, SG is a University governance group, which means you must **refrain** from giving opinions.
    - Social media is an extension of you be careful and think about what you are putting on your social media. Are you trying to sway or educate? Think about who might be viewing your pages.
      - You have the freedom to post whatever you want.
  - o Policy C10: Political & Legislative Activities Policy for **Student Organizations** 
    - Recognized student organizations may:
      - Receive permission to host partisan events

- Endorse a political party, candidate for public office
- Participate in campaign-related activities
- May NOT:
  - Compensate a public official
  - Place signs
  - Use university resources or student activity fee dollars
  - Host campaign rallies
- Use of University Resources
  - Recognized Student Orgs may NOT use university resources for partisan activities
  - They may use for **NON**-partisan
- Questions?

    - RSOs in their own capacity are like student organizations, you are not in Student Government unless you are hosting an event with SG money or voting in SG.
