Middle States Reaccreditation update

Larry Buckley, Associate Dean of COS

- Accreditation is extremely important in order for RIT to operate.
- It is a heavy and long process, so I hope to come back to give more updates.
- Steering Committee is Co-Chaired by Christine Licata, Larry Buckley, and
- Self-Study Design Approved on August 15th, 2024 (this is good!).
- Dr. Sean McKitrick, MSCHE Vice President for Field Relations left at the end of August (not so good).
 - o However, a new VP was assigned to RIT: Mr. Bobby Nathan
- Reflect -> Innovate -> Transform
 - o The theme of the reaccreditation.
 - We want to do more to show MSCHE what we do, not just the bare minimum.
 - o Demonstrating compliance with 7 standards (reflect).
 - What makes RIT unique? (innovate)
- Working Groups:
 - 8 Working Groups established = 59 Faculty/Staff
 - Mission and Goals
 - Ethics and Integrity
 - Design & Delivery of Student Learning Experience
 - Support of Student Experience
 - Education Effectiveness Assessment
 - Planning, Resources, and Institutional Improvement
 - Governance, Leadership, and Administration
 - Evidence Inventory (newest one)
- Institutional Priorities
 - What are the core priorities of your institution?
 - 3 main things (limited to 3 by MSCHE)
 - Student Success
 - Unanimously voted by students/staff/faculty.

- Research
- Community Well-Being
 - Came as a surprise. We put a poll out to pick our 3rd priority and the majority opinion was for this.
- Affiliate Groups Established
 - Used for each priority area.
 - They analyze the Lines of Inquiry (LOI) for each Priority Area and prepare a report.
- Important Dates:
 - Spring 2025: External Visiting Team Chair Selected.
 - o Early Fall 2025: External visiting team chair visits campus.
 - August 25th, 2025: First draft of self study circulated to RIT Community for feedback.
 - March/April 2026: Site visit to RIT by external visiting team.
 - June 2026: MSCHE Action on Reaccreditation.

 - What does reaccreditation with honors mean?
 - They would use our self study to show other universities. It is a sense of pride for us to be the example.
 - What ranking do you expect us to be for Carnegie Classification?
 - R3 -> R2 -> R1
 - We need to be spending more research money to get to R1, we're about 3 times under.
 - It won't be a quick process to get there.
 - Faculty Senate: If we get to D2 sports, we'd be an R2-D2 school.

Bylaw Amendments

 - Article 1, Section 1 Subsection B
 - Changes language from female to women
 - Removed "Office of" from Fraternity and Sorority Life.
 - Article 1, Section 1 Subsection D
 - Sustainability was removed last year, being replaced with Wellbeing
 - Greek: Would we hire a new committee chair?
 - o Yes, next semester.
 - Article 2, Section 1 Subsection D
 - Removed sustainability.

PawPrints

- Don't require students to pay for homework services for individual classes
 - DSR motions to charge PawPrint to Academics & Co-Op Committee
 - Seconded: Greek Senator
 - Discussion:
 - None

 - PawPrint is charged to Academics & Co-ops Committee
- Extend Adobe Creative Cloud Access to all students
 - DSR motions to charge PawPrint to Student Affairs Committee
 - Seconded: CHST Senator
 - Discussion:
 - VP: Every student is apart of Adobe Express
 - CAD has Creative Cloud
 - This would be to give minor and SOIS student
 - CET: Why Student Affairs and not CAD?
 - o CAD already has it. This would go to who works on licensing.
 - Greek: Would Dir. of Tech be more fit for this?
 - Finance:
 - Why is this not going to Academics & Co-op?

- Nicole: The communication would go through student affairs.
- VP: Would love to work on this as well.
- Vote:
 - Yes: 12No: 0Abstain: 1
 - PawPrint is charged to Student Affairs Committee
- Let Gracie's Swipes Roll Over
 - Discussion:
 - GCCIS: Maybe this student didn't have time to use all 50 swipes, why should they lose them?
 - SCB: Did you discuss making a smaller plan instead of 50/100 Gracies swipes?
 - The 50 swipes have higher dining dollars and the 100 swipes have lower dining dollars. Students with 50 just need to go 3 times a week, not a day.
 - Greek:
 - I think this response doesn't answer the PawPrint, but just pushing for students to use Gracies. I don't see why rolling over is an issue, but it isn't addressing the response.
 - COS:
 - Why are food insecurities mentioned in this?
 - Ops: Students tend to hoard their dining dollars/swipes because they
 fear they are going to run out. RIT did hire a person to cover this. You
 can meet with them and plan the exact times and days you can spend
 your dining dollars wisely.
 - GCCIS:
 - I still don't see why there isn't a small amount that can roll over.
 - Greek:
 - I don't think this is ready to be closed.
 - CET:
 - I think this still touches on a good point, but the original PawPrint should be discussed.
 - Housing & Dining:
 - They compare RIT to other schools, and there aren't a lot of schools that let anything roll over at all while we do. There may be a business side to this.
 - Finance:
 - Just because another university does something different, doesn't mean that we have to follow them. We're supposed to be a cutting edge university, not following others.
 - Nicole:
 - Those who have an issue with the response, please think about attending Housing & Dining Committee to talk to Don.
 - Nothing was motioned, response goes back to committee to be worked on.

- Ops: Driver sheet for Munson's Halloween Party is in the top level of the drive. Just click on the drive and it should be there (it's not in a folder).
