# Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHe) Reaccreditation Update - Christina Licata

- Christina is located in Eastman Building and is the Vice Provost for the university!
- Reaccreditation helps the University receive funding from the US department of education.
   Reaccredition focuses on the student experience to see if an institution can stay accredited to receive this funding. Middlestates is our regional body that decides if we can be an accredited university.
- This reaccredition process occurs once every 8 years. Michelle Snow was the student representative on the steering committee!!
- Where are we in the process?
  - The first step was to create a self-study to collect student experience on campus, submitted in September 2025.
  - Institutional Priorities draft submitted in September 2025
    - Created 3 priorities
      - Improve Student Success
      - Expand Research Enterprise
      - Prioritize community well-being.
    - Asking the governance groups to see how well RIT is aligning with these priorities
- Reaccredition visit
  - Dr. Nariman Farvardin of Stevens Institute of Technology is our external team chair who will be visiting throughout the year to evaluate our progress on our priorities!
  - His first visit will be on Oct. 2nd to become familiar with RIT, provide feedback on the first draft self study, and meet with students, faculty and staff.
  - The Evaluation team visit will be from March 29, 2026 April 1st 2026 to finalize reaccredition process
    - On April 1st, there will be an open forum to share their findings of RIT in Ingle Auditorium
- Possible Outcomes
  - June 2026: Commission takes action
  - We can either be reaccredited, need to submit more information or be denied.
- Questions
  - President: What are some short goals that we are focusing on?
    - Middlestates is focusing on the finances of universities to ensure stability

#### **Ombuds - Joe Johnston**

- Joe is the Director of Ombuds and their office is located next to the DSO Office, across from the Davis room
- Ombuds is a confidential, neutral, independent and informal resource on campus. They are not mandated reporters, only have to report issues if there is harm involved to the individual or another person
- Ombuds can not be a part of the formal process, however they can guide and help you to a solution. They can also talk to other departments for you to help you get a picture of how a problem may be resolved
- Come to the Ombuds office when you feel...

- Treated unfairly, unable to resolve a conflict, trouble facilitating communication
- Scope of Ombuds
  - We do:
    - Listen and support confidentially
    - Help discuss options, strategies and step of resolution
    - Coach individuals through the conflict management and resolution processes
  - We do not:
    - Serve as an office of notice to the University
    - Have administrative decision-making author
    - Advocate for individuals in a dispute but will advocate for fairness
- What we do
  - Meet with visitors students/faculty/parents
  - Anonymous fact finding

    - We usually set aside an hour with a "client" and then set up more meetings as needed but there is no limit

  - Talked with FMS and they said there were issues with safety and currently no plan to reopen. They are exploring options to remove the ramp to add stairs to make it a safer option and potentially re-open
