Promote Student Success

Students struggle for variety of reasons. Let's get them the help they need...now.

Avoid Long Term Consequences

Lack of intervention can have longer-term consequences, such as:

- Risk to financial aid and SAP
- Decrease in program retention
- Prolonged struggle without timely intervention



Encourage Intervention

Pairing an academic intervention with the terms of your departmental probation or suspension can be a simple and effective way to ensure students are developing the skills for long-term academic success!

Options to Discuss

Struggling with test prep, studying, and test anxiety	→	Moderate: Applied Study Strategies (ASC)	Severe: CRP
Difficulty with math and science content	→	ASC Services (e.g. SI for limited courses, individual assessments, Critical Math Skills, Core Physics Concepts)	
Challenges with motivation, time management, and procrastination	→	Moderate: CRP	Severe: CRP
Uncertainty about current major, career, and/or next steps	→	Moderate: Career Counseling	Severe: CRP
Eligible for probation or suspension	→	College Restoration Program (CRP)
