RIT Advocate & Advisor of Choice

Students may opt to work with an Advisor of Choice or Title IX Conduct Advocate. An advocate is a knowledgeable faculty or staff member who can meet with you prior to your hearing and can support you during the hearing.

Can be a parent, attorney, or other non RIT-member		●
Can accompany student to appointment to listen to recording of original hearing (if preparing for an appeal)	●	●
