Survey History

- Biennial survey of all main campus RIT faculty
- Started in 2014
- Typically sent in the middle of fall semester
- CTL staff use the data to drive future decision-making

Survey Design

- Section 1: myCourses Satisfaction
 - Six questions Multiple choice, Likert Scale, and logic-based short answer questions
- Section 2: Other EdTech Tool Satisfaction
 - Four questions Likert scale, rank order, and logic-based short answer questions
- Section 3: Demographic Questions


Survey Distribution

 - Targeted email blasts
 - Faculty Senate endorsed outreach
- Survey remained open for 3 weeks


27% response rate (n = 290)


Course Delivery Methods



Self-Rated Tech Competency




Position at RIT






College at RIT


LMS Overall Satisfaction




Why are you dissatisfied with myCourses (D2L)?

UX/UI Reasons for Dissatisfaction






Satisfaction with Specific Aspects of myCourses (D2L) Features with *Satisfaction* >50%

"The tool is just clunky. It isn't intuitive and just isn't robust enough for a school that has IT in its name."

"MyCourses has many useful features, but its lack of consistent UI for any given task along with limitations is frustrating"

"Everything about the interface is too "clicky" -- too many clicks and steps to get to edit text, to move things, to edit grade details, etc."

Other Academic Technologies Satisfaction

Satisfaction with Additional EdTech Tools

- > 79% of respondents are satisfied with Zoom Video Conferencing
- 25% of respondents are satisfied with Turnitin Originality Checking tool
 - 50% of respondents indicated they do not use Turnitin
- More than 60% of respondents indicated they do not use the following tools:
 - Camtasia (Self-Recording)
 - Gradescope (Grading Efficiency)
 - iClicker (Student Response System)
 - Panopto (Self-Recording and Video Hosting)


Reasons for Not Using Other Tools

"The technologies I have not used are not relevant to my course delivery."


"I was not even aware of these systems, except Zoom."
