JOURNAL Pen-International 2006 Summer Leadership Institute *August 5-12, 2006*



I was at DLS-CSB at 2:45 a.m., ready to depart for the airport. The school van fetched us at 3:00 a.m. I was with Melissa, Miracle Stephanie, and Archieval. We arrived at NAIA and got in line with the other people for inspection of our tickets and passports. We waited at the departure area of the lobby from 3:00 until 6:00 in the morning. We waited patiently and tried not to go to sleep. The Cathay Pacific plane then left at 6:50 a.m. for Hong Kong.

So I searched and searched and I found it and then I returned to my seat. Not I know how to use the airplane comfort room.

I fell asleep while Archieval was looking outside at the clouds. Then Archieval woke me up and I felt some pain in my ears and I can't open my mouth. I got some candy and gum to help me. I went to sleep again and the next time I woke up my butt felt very painful from sitting for such a long time. Later we were informed that we were going to arrive in **LONDON**, **ENGLAND**.

We arrived there on **August 5**, **2006** at 4:38 p.m. The first thing we had to do was try to exchange our money to British Pound. Then I wanted to look for my

auntie and uncle who would meet us at the airport. I am very happy to see my auntie and uncle from London. They showed us how to go to Terminal 3 of the Heathrow Airport where we will meet the other delegates from the different countries. We began to get hungry so we looked for food to eat. The other delegates arrived later. First there was Russia, then Japan, and last was China at 8:50 p.m. We then rode the bus to go to the Castle. It was very cool in the bus and we were very so I slept during the bus ride for 3 hours.



We arrived at **Bader Hall** and we were welcomed by the people from Pen-International. It was a very cold night and we had not eaten yet but we were given some bread and orange juice.



My roommate is *Miracle* and we are assigned in **Room 64** this is a picture of the door lock and our card key. On **August 6**, **2006** we dressed and changed and walked to Herstmonceux Castle. We walked around the place taking pictures and we were all so happy. We ate breakfast and went to the conference hall where we had our intoroductions with the

participants of the different countries.

my friend Zhang. We tried to communicate some more and tried to explain things clearly by giving examples. She was a person who smiled a lot and it was easy to

make friends with Zhang. Then we joined the pair of Chiaki Mori from Japan whose partner was Miracle from the Philippines.


My Dorm Room
