

My Journal



July 31, 2006, Monday

Later, Ms. Rubylee called us to go to the office of the Executive Vice President to present ourselves as the student ambassadors to the Summer Leadership Institute. We went to the EVP's office with Ms. Nicky, Ms. Tess, Sir John and Ms. Earnest.

Afterwards I left for Robinson's Ermita to buy some things and then my mommy and I went home. I still had to prepare my things and pack my clothes in my luggage and my mommy helped me to organize it. I felt I lacked rest and sleep.

August 5, 2006, Saturday

I arrived at DLS-CSB with my parents and there I met up with Aval, Joyce, Melissa, Ms. Nicky, Ms. Tess and Sir John. We rode the school van to go to the Ninoy Aquino International Airport. I dod not feel well because I still lacked sleep and rest. I really felt that I needed to rest.

We arrived at the airport and this was my first time to see the place. I saw Filipinos and foreigners showing their tickets and passports to the checkers at the gate. For our breakfast we ate the snacks served by Cathay.

We rode the airplane of Cathay Pacific and I though it was beautiful, it was the first time I saw stewardesses who I thought were pretty. On our way to Hong Kong I caught the sight of the Philippines underneath and I thought it was so beautiful but there were areas that were poor and dirty. I slept deeply on the plane.

We arrived in Hong Kong Airport and we still needed to walk to Gate 15 that I felt was so far from where we arrived. Finally, again, we were on the airplane on our way to England. Again I slept deeply.


I really miss my boyfriend, my family, my dogs, my classmates and some of the other SDEAS students and faculty. But I really miss my boyfriend the most.

August 6, 2006, Sunday

We walked to the castle where we ate breakfast. After breakfast, we went to the conference room and I met the student ambassadors from Japan, USA, Russia, and China and they were chatting with each other using different sign languages. That was something that I was really aware of.

I listened to Dr. DeCaro and Dr. Kavin who welcomed us and we also had an orientation. I also interacted with the other countries but was able to chat more with my partner, a Japanese female student named Chiaki. She is very nice and friendly. But I didn't understand her sign language too much so sometimes we used pen and paper for communicating.





August 7, 2006, Monday

After breakfast, I walked to the conference room with the CSB group and we listened to the talk of Dr. and Mrs. Hurwitz about "The Making of Deaf Leaders". They also shared their life experience. I admire them because of their stories on how they were leaders. thought it was beautiful.

August 9, 2006, Wednesday


After breakfast we went to White Cliff and Brighton for a fieldtrip. We really enjoyed the trip. I saw houses and places that were so simple and beautiful.

Today we also heard the bad news about what happened at the England airport about the plan to plant a bomb in the airplanes. I was really afraid but I prayed to God.

After the lectures we had a party for our closing reception. I interacted with the members of the other countries. I want to remember them because they are my friends. I really miss them... and I want to thank them for everything.



August 12, 2006, Saturday

Now, we leave for the Philippines...I was in the airport and I was a bit nervous. It was my first time to experience this... Everyone was so serious and very careful.... I felt bad because everyone was so strict and I felt that it was too much.
