

T. Alan Hurwitz, a prelingually deaf son of deaf parents, is President of the National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID), Vice President of Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), and Dean of the NTID. Dr. Hurwitz holds the rank of Professor at NTID and has taught courses in Mathematics, Electronics, and Computer Science, and in the Interpreter Education and Graduate Teacher Preparation programs. He was an Electronics Engineer and Senior Numerical Control Programmer at McDonnell Douglas Corporation for five years prior to joining the NTID faculty in 1970. Dr. Hurwitz served as President of the National Association of the Deaf 1982-1984. He received his B.S. in Electrical Engineering from Washington University at St. Louis, M.S. degree in Electrical Engineering from St. Louis University, and Ed.D. in Teaching and Curriculum from the University of Rochester.

Alan is married to Vicki and they have two grown hard-of-hearing and deaf children, and they are proud grandparents of two.
