Title:	PEN-International Business Meeting: Past Accomplishments and Future Directions
Workshop Developer:	DeCaro and Clymer
Description:	To provide participants with an understanding of the current status of various PEN-International initiatives and accomplishments. Future plans and activities will be described. Plenty of time for discussion.

Title:	Personal and Career Counseling Theory and Strategies with Deaf College-Age Students
Workshop Developer:	Robb Adams, Associate Professor and Department Chairperson Department: NTID Counseling Services Department
Description:	A three-hour workshop that will introduce participants to theoretical paradigms and practical applications for counseling deaf college-age students
Goals:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participants will understand the differences between a “medical model” vs. a developmental and a systemic model for understanding diversity among deaf people. • Participants will develop a basic lesson plan utilizing at least one of the strategies presented in the workshop. • Participants will delineate that knowledge and those skills they consider important as workshop follow-up.

Title:	Working with Interpreters in the Classroom
Workshop Developer:	Kathy Darroch
Description:	This workshop is designed to provide college-level instructors with a brief history of the development of sign language interpreting as a profession in the United States. The role and function of an interpreter in a college-level educational setting will be introduced, and strategies will be discussed that instructors can incorporate to effectively integrate instructional techniques and interpreting.
Goals:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the establishment of sign language interpreting as a profession and basic ethical principles that guide professional interpreters in their work. • Learn about the role of an interpreter in the classroom and models of effective communication. • Learn strategies for adapting instructional methods to complement interpreting services and create an accessible communication environment. • Analyze case studies of classroom situations that model successful and unsuccessful integration of interpreting services.

Title:	Strategies for Increasing Student Interaction in the Classroom
Workshop Developer:	Mary Lou Basile NTID Business Careers Department
Description:	This three-hour workshop will introduce faculty from PEN-International partner universities to specific strategies that foster student interaction in the classroom
Goals:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participants will develop an understanding of research showing that classroom interaction enhances learning. • Participants will be exposed to a variety of classroom strategies that foster interaction. • Participants will develop several strategies for student interaction that they can use in their own classrooms.

Wednesday 7:15 – 8:30	<p>“A Wild Patience Has Taken Me This Far” – Wisdom from a Life Marilyn Smith</p> <p>The making of ADWAS is a complex story. Experiencing and witnessing gross injustice, a deep-seated need to create a Deaf-friendly workplace, and a background in strong work ethics are just a few of the things that lead to the creation of the first agency serving Deaf victims of sexual assault and domestic violence in this country. Eighteen years later there is no question that authentic and passionate leadership and a clear vision, coupled with a willingness to continuously learn on the job and to test uncharted waters made a positive impact and belief in possibilities for Deaf America. It is my hope that by showing my personal story and lessons and the story of ADWAS has and can challenge the thinking of many people - both hearing and Deaf.</p>

An explanation of the legal responsibilities and duties of postsecondary educational institutions in the context of Section 504 and Title II of the ADA with particular emphasis on the provision of academic adjustments, and auxiliary aids and services for hard of hearing and Deaf students.</p>
Friday 10 – 11:15	<p>Serving Students who are Hard of Hearing in Postsecondary Settings Sam Trychin</p> <p>This presentation includes information on issues related to identifying students who are hard of hearing, identifying their academic and psychosocial risks, identifying the frequently observed communication barriers in academic/training settings, and identifying the various strategies and tactics that aid in accommodating hearing loss in postsecondary situations. The presentation will also include frequently held misconceptions about hearing loss and a discussion of reasons why students who are hard of hearing frequently do not take steps to compensate for their sensory deficit.
