Publication Requirement Policy v2¹

PhD in Computing and Information Sciences

Policy Statement

A Ph.D. student is required to be the primary author of at least one high-impact or equivalent publication based on research during their Ph.D. studies before graduation from the Ph.D. program.

Procedure

- 1. Students and/or advisor will provide written information detailing why the student's publication is considered high-impact.
- 2. All material will be submitted to the *Curriculum and Assessment Committee* and the *PhD Director* for review and approval.
- 3. A list of top-tier publishing venues appropriate to the Ph.D. research domain, *Top-tier Conference and Journal List*, is maintained by the *Curriculum and Assessment Committee* with input from Ph.D. faculty. A publication that conforms to this list is considered to be high-impact.
- 4. A publication that has a high-impact on the field must be supported by objective written evidence to this effect.
- 5. Other publications may be approved with written justification.
